Though we have not had full-time students at the ranch sinch March, we have continued to have interaction with numerous students at Broken Arrow and at a number of events off site.

What we are most excited about and grateful for is God's answer to all of our prayers for new ranch parents. Howard and Karen Floyd are officially joining the ranch family staff November 1st. I recently did an interview with them to give you a glimpse and get to know them a bit. The following is a summary of what was asked and shared.

Todd: I would like to start by asking you to tell us a little bit about yourselves. **Howard and Karen:** We met in our grade 12 year at Western Christian College in Weyburn. We dated on and off again over the next couple years before dating full time and getting married on October 9, 1989. At that time Howard was going through to be a teacher and Karen was taking a general secretary course.

We were living at Disley and one day Howard shared that he had always wanted to sell cars! This was the start of many years in the car industry working for Regina Mazda, McMillan Motor Products (Kipling) and Indian Head Chrysler working in sales then as service manager. National Truth & Reconciliation Day Every Child Matters



Broken Arrow held its first Truth and Reconciliation Walk-Run this September 30th, remembering and honoring the lives of the children and families affected by residential school trauma. We had 15 participants ranging from 80 years to one-month old! Our eldest, was my dear mother, Margaret Popescul, with our youngest being our newest granddaughter, Finnley! September 30th is a day all of us are encouraged to wear orange. *"Orange Shirt Day is an* Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of Every Child Matters" (www.Canada.ca). The orange t-shirt is worn to remember every child who did not return home. Hearing the stories of the many who attended residential schools is heart wrenching. Many of the children experienced severe trauma and abuse. One of my roles at the ranch is being an advocate and trainer for Plan to Protect. We have a moral and legal responsibility to ensure all levels of our organization are aware of the prevalence of abuse in society; and, to ensure we at Broken Arrow are doing everything possible to protect and prevent abuse from happening. The statistics of child abuse are staggering. One in 3 females and 1 in 6 males in Canada experience some form of sexual abuse before the age of 18. "In all cases, 95% of abuse is at the hand of people whom are close to us - siblings, parents relatives, cousins" (Melodie Bissell, Plan to Protect). I want to see these statistics change dramatically. I want to see abuse eradicated and rare - not a reality for so many of our children and teens. One of the great attributes of love is to protect. Love always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres (1 Cor. 13:7). The scriptures are clear we have been given the responsibility to love and protect children - all children - because every child matters.

Broken Arrow is committed to helping every child know they are loved and they matter. Our desire is to bring truth, reconciliation, and restoration through the saving grace of Jesus Christ. Children are of great importance to Jesus.

He interacted with them and happily prayed for them. Some of Jesus's disciples thought He was too important and too busy with greater matters, than tp give His time and attention to the little children. But Jesus welcomed them! He said, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not hinder them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 19:14). Every child matters to God; and therefore, every child must matters to us.

As Program Director, I join the rest of our ministry team in being thankful for our new ranch parents, Howard and Karen. God has answered our prayers and provided! I am also thankful to be welcoming a new student into our program this November. We look forward to working with both him and his family; witnessing God's amazing grace and transforming power of love.

(Continued from Page 1) We decided then to check it out and went to visit the ranch. We spent lots of time with Todd and Lara that weekend. Since then God has put doors and opened them where we didn't ever know there should be doors. Our house sold within a few days of being listed! Todd: We've been praying for over two years now that God would call a couple...this is not a job or position...it is a calling. Tell us a bit about how you came to discover that this is God's call upon your life for this season? Howard and Karen: We guess in some ways we've been a little bit like Jonah because God reached out to us several years ago, then He reached out again and this third time! We thought "We're being asked by God to do this a third time - we need to sit up and pay attention." We prayed about it quite a bit. Our trust in God has never been so strong; we really have no idea what it is going to be like or what to expect, but we're just giving it to God and allowing it to happen. Todd: What are some of your dreams and hopes as you embark on this adventure? Howard and Karen: We hope that we can find ways

to relate to the students and them to us. We have had very different family lives growing up; but I think the two of us complement each other because of it. We want to be able to provide a healthy and safe environment for each student that comes so they can feel a weight has been lifted.

Todd: We always explain to people that Broken Arrow is simply one big family walking alongside of other families. How do you view that idea as you step into this role? **Howard and Karen:** How we picture this is when you are coming on to the ranch at the top of the hill where the sign is, it's like looking at the front door of this house called Broken Arrow and as you come to the different buildings and parts of the ranch it's like entering different rooms that are all part of the same house. We don't see a bunch of individual dwellings rather it's all one home that we are living in and sharing. That makes us all unified. God is the head and we are His vessels.

Todd: Is there something that you would like to say to the greater Broken Arrow family as you become part of this family? **Howard and Karen:** It is very humbling that people have been praying for this...for us! We feel enclosed like where you are in the middle of a circle, everyone arm in arm embracing us, then we get to step back and become part of the circle. We feel we're entering at a time where a lot has already been done, fields have been prepared and seeds planted. We think we are arriving at a time where we can help nurture some of those seeds and prepare for another harvest.

Todd: Karen and Howard, we are delighted that you have listened to and obeyed God's call on your lives! Welcome to the Broken Arrow family!

In closing, I encourage you all to plan a visit soon to Broken Arrow Youth Ranch to meet this amazing couple, our new student(s), and get reacquainted with the rest of the gang! Thank you Lord for the great things you have done and all You will
